GREEN STEWARDS

All league teams are expected to act as Green Steward on a rota basis, as detailed on the league playing schedules published by the League Secretary.

Daytime leagues are now covered by a team of volunteers: new helpers are always welcome; if you are interested please contact a member of the management committee.

The duties are:

Retrieve Cash Box, check that float in box is correct, check that all keys are in place.

Retrieve league scorecards from cupboard behind reception desk.

Collect rink fees, and enter amounts on booking sheet plus any competition or roll-up fees due (all fees on desk notice).

Complete booking sheet, have it checked and countersigned, put tear-off slip and monies collected in tube and place in safe (located by green entrance slope).

Evening Stewards: before leaving, put keys in Cash Box, and secure.

Answer calls, both telephone and at the door, as required. Please note business calls and deliveries on the pad provided, and, if possible, leave a copy of a telephone message for the person concerned. A duplicate pad for telephone messages is situated by the telephone.

GENERAL BYE-LAWS GOVERNING PLAY

A1 LAWS OF THE GAME

The Laws of the Sport of Indoor Bowls and the E.I.B.A. Ltd National Championship Rules shall apply in all circumstances not covered by these Bye Laws.

A2 ORGANISATION

These Bye Laws apply to the Camberley and District Indoor Bowling Club (hereafter referred to as the “Club” or “CIBC”).

The Men’s Competition Secretary shall be responsible for the administration of the Club’s men’s and mixed competitions and shall be accountable to the Bowling Committee.

The Ladies Competition Secretary shall be responsible for the administration of the Club’s ladies’ competitions and shall be accountable to the Bowling Committee.

The League Secretary shall be responsible for the administration of the Club’s league programme and shall be accountable to the Bowling Committee.

A3 RINK BEHAVIOUR

RUNNING on the green is strictly prohibited.

Use of ‘grip’o’, ‘glycerine’, ‘rosewater’, ‘non water-based chalk puffers’ or similar items are not allowed.

No food, of any kind, is to be taken past the stairways onto the green surrounds.

Members must not conduct themselves on or off the green in a manner likely to cause damage to the club's high reputation.

A4 DRESS

For Club Matches

White shirt with collar and sleeves, Club tie (men only - optional) – CIBC Coloured Shirts for specified Matches

Coloured waistcoats/cardigans (ladies only - optional)

White trousers - white skirts - white socks (men only) -

(except - for matches specified as ‘greys’ - grey trousers
- grey skirts)

For Competition semi-finals and finals

White, or predominantly white, shirt with collar and sleeves, Club tie (men only - optional); CIBC Club Coloured Shirts are also permitted

Coloured waistcoats/cardigans (ladies only – optional)

White trousers - white skirts - white socks (men only)

For Roll-ups, leagues, competitions, etc.

White, or predominantly white, shirt with collar and sleeves - Outdoor or CIBC Club Coloured Shirts are also permitted)

Coloured waistcoats/cardigans (ladies only) - optional

Grey trousers - grey skirts

REGULATION BOWLS SHOES must be worn at all times whilst on the green.

(Note: the club’s dress code is relaxed for coaching school pupils under instruction, whereby smart casual clothing may be worn during the training sessions (regulation bowls shoes are still required). This also applies to novice bowlers having ‘roll-up’ sessions, and is intended to encourage new bowlers to participate more fully in the game in their initial few weeks in the club, perhaps whilst deciding whether the game is for them or not!)

A5 COST OF RINKS

Cost of rinks will be as determined by the Management Committee from time to time, and will be displayed at the Reception Desk.

A6 FAILURE TO ATTEND

For a Booked session (league or competition) by one team - a team failing to attend within 10 minutes of the due time shall:

1. Forfeit the match to the opposing team (if a league, the

opposing team will have a 10-0 win recorded in their favour) and:

2. Pay the green fees of both teams, as a penalty payment, irrespective of whether the rink is used. Failure to pay will result in a follow-up notice. Continued failure may lead to suspension.

Failure to attend by both teams - where neither team attends for play within 10 minutes of the due time, the match will be declared void.

If the match is a league match, both teams will have a 10-0 loss recorded against them.

If a competition both teams will be eliminated.

In either case, the captains of the teams concerned will be billed for the full green fees for their team, irrespective of whether the rink is used. Failure to pay will result in a follow-up notice. Continued failure to pay may lead to suspension from the Club.

A7 RINK BOOKING PROCEDURES

ALL RINK BOOKINGS must be made, provisionally, on the relevant rink booking sheet held in the book at the Reception Desk, and, when confirmed, authorised by a Bowling Committee member, or person authorised by the Bowling Committee. (Note: 2 dates only may be provisionally booked for an External Competition)

Provisional bookings will be held open for a maximum of 3 days awaiting confirmation by opponent, after which they will be cancelled, and the session time made available for others. **Only Bowling Committee Members, or persons authorised by the Bowling Committee, may make transfers of confirmed bookings to the Rink Diary.**

A single (2 hour) session only may be booked for club competition singles, open two wood pairs, and novice pairs - the match may commence early if booked for 10.00am, subject to prior arrangement to allow for earlier opening of the club, or overrun if booked for the last evening session midweek, or where the following session has not previously

GENERAL BYE-LAWS GOVERNING PLAY

been booked for another match.

A league game may not be moved to an alternative rink in favour of an internal club competition, except, in the circumstances set out below, to enable a four hour club competition game access to a rink for a double session.

1. Where a two hour league game is scheduled on a rink having the previous or following sessions vacant that game will, if required, move to another available rink in the same session to enable a four hour club competition game to take place. If no other rink is available the league may not be moved.
2. A league game shall not be moved under this rule where any other rink has both sessions free in the same four hour period.
3. When under this rule a competition game is entered in the rink session sheets the captains of the moved league teams shall be notified of the change of rinks as soon as this is confirmed and may rearrange their game.

This arrangement will apply to all rounds up to the semi-final.

A league game may be moved to an alternative rink in favour of an external (nationals, counties etc.) competition, subject to meeting provisions of sub-paragraph 3 above.

Rinks may only be booked for a 'roll-up' where the number of players is a minimum of 8 people – the person booking the rink will be responsible for the collection, and payment to the club, of the appropriate rink fees.

If a confirmed rink booking is not taken up, the member booking the rink will be charged the full rink fee, which would have been chargeable for the match, unless the booking was cancelled in advance, and noted in the Rink Diary.

A8 NATIONAL, COUNTY AND OTHER EXTERNAL COMPETITION BOOKINGS

Within the season, rinks are left free during midweek league

GENERAL BYE-LAWS GOVERNING PLAY

sessions (day and evening) primarily for use by competitors in national, county and other external competitions.

League sessions or Internal Club Competitions may only be postponed in favour of an external competition as a last resort, and then only with permission from the League (or Competition) Secretary, subject to no other day being possible, and no other rink being available, unless exceptional circumstances (as determined by the relevant Secretary) apply.

Competitors may not approach league or competition team captains before the relevant Secretary has agreed postponement. Following agreement of postponement, at least 3 days notice must be given, by the person booking the rink, to the captains of the league or competition teams concerned.

League and/or Internal Club Competition matches may be postponed in favour of Club Matches or National, County or other External Competition semi-finals, area finals, and/or finals, at the discretion of the League or relevant Competition Secretary.

Under no circumstances will rinks, which have been booked and confirmed for matches involving visiting competitors, be cancelled and taken for other matches.

Matches scheduled to be played away must NOT be played at home, unless a free rink can be found - rinks booked for other purposes may not be cancelled, under any circumstances, to accommodate these matches.

A9 CONTRAVENTION OF BYE LAWS

Members contravening these bye-laws, or those for leagues or competitions, where no specific penalty is laid down, will be verbally warned by a member of the Bowling Committee in the first instance. Further contravention will result in a written caution. Any subsequent transgression may lead to suspension (or possible expulsion).

Any disputes between league teams or competitors as to the interpretation of the bye laws should be referred to the

GENERAL BYE-LAWS GOVERNING PLAY

League or Competition Secretary concerned who shall consider the facts of the case and arrive at a decision.

In certain circumstances the relevant secretary may refer the case to the Bowling Committee, who will appoint a Sub-Committee (of 3 members) to adjudicate on the matter. The member(s) in dispute have the right to present their case(s) personally before the Sub-Committee, before a decision is reached, which may include action(s) not elsewhere laid down.

Members are reminded that no set of rules can cater for every situation, and that unusual incidents not specifically provided for in either these bye-laws or the laws of the game may occur. The Bowling Committee will always endeavour to apply commonsense to resolve any such problems.

BYE-LAWS FOR CLUB LEAGUES

B1 ELIGIBILITY

All League Bowlers shall be playing members of the Club, whose club subscriptions are up-to-date.

B2 REGISTRATION

One member of each league team shall be appointed as the team's captain. Prior to the start of each league season the League Secretary will send a League Team Registration Form to the captain of each league team that has been previously registered.

The captain shall be responsible for the registration of the league team by returning a completed League Team Registration Form, together with appropriate fees, to the League Secretary on or before the closing date stipulated on the form. A team shall not be permitted to play an unregistered player, or a player currently registered with another team in the same league (or another division of the same league). Any team playing an unregistered player(s) shall have 2 points deducted from their league total in respect of each match concerned.

Team captains may register additional players or de-register members that have resigned from their team at any time during the season, using the Additional League Players Registration Form available from the League Secretary's registration form box (situated by the ramp entrance to the green). Registrations of new players will not be considered unless submitted on the correct form. A player resigning from a team will not be eligible for re-registration in the same league (or another division of the same league) in the same season.

- Pairs: each team shall register a minimum of 4 and a maximum of 6 players.
- Triples: each team shall register a minimum of 5 and a maximum of 8 players.
- Fours: each team shall register a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 10 players

B3 APPLICATION OF NEW TEAM

Any team wishing to enter a league in the following season should enter the contact details for their team captain on the appropriate League Programme Sign-up Sheet. These sheets are located in the League Programme Sign-up Sheet folder that is normally available on the Reception desk towards the end of the Winter League season.

Any team wishing to enter a league in the current season should contact the League Secretary at the earliest opportunity.

The League Secretary may, at his discretion, refuse a request to enter a new team in a league in circumstances where this would be impractical.

The League Secretary will send a League Team Registration Form to the captain of each new league team.

The captain shall be responsible for the registration of the league team by returning a completed League Team Registration Form, together with appropriate fees, to the League Secretary on or before the closing date stipulated on the form

B4 TIME OF PLAY

All league matches must be played on the day and time allocated, unless the match is officially postponed (see Bye Law B5) or special circumstances prevail. Special circumstances shall be determined as such by the League Secretary and will only be invoked in situations beyond the control of the teams concerned (this does not include holidays, other engagements, etc).

The defaulters will pay the total rink fee and opposing team awarded 2 points and 10 shots. (in the event of both teams defaulting, each team will pay their own rink fees and each have a 10-0 loss recorded against them). See bye-law A6.

B5 OFFICIAL POSTPONEMENT

A league match may be postponed where the rink is required for official club matches or national / county / other external

competitions. See bye-law A8.

A match that has been postponed should be re-arranged by the two league team captains concerned, and the new date and time notified to the League Secretary. Failure to play a postponed match will result in both captains being billed for the rink fees.

Team captains must be given at least 72 hours notice of any alterations to the playing schedule.

B6 TEAM PLAYING CONSTITUTIONS

Mixed leagues: at least one member of the opposite sex.

Open leagues: any combination.

Men's leagues: men only.

Ladies leagues: ladies only.

Failure to abide by these regulations will result in the game being forfeited and a 10-0 score recorded against the offending team.

B7 TWO HOUR LEAGUE MATCHES

These matches shall be a maximum of 2 hours duration.

Pairs: shall be a maximum of 18 ends

Triples: shall be a maximum of 16 ends

Fours: shall be a maximum of 18 ends

2 points will be awarded for a Win

1 point for a Draw.

The match will not start until the start of session bell rings

An illegally delivered jack (i.e. which comes to rest outside the confines of the rink) will be 'placed' by the opposing skip, who may also direct where the mat is to be positioned.

If, during the course of an end, the jack is caused to leave the side of the rink, the end will be counted as a played end, and the opposing team will be deemed to have won the end by 1 shot. The team awarded the penalty shot shall place the mat and cast the jack on the following end. In the event of a 'tied

BYE-LAWS FOR CLUB LEAGUES

end', i.e. when the nearest bowl of each team is equidistant from the jack, the end shall not be replayed, but entered on the scorecard as having been played without any score indicated to either team.

The 7-minute warning bell will signify that no further end can be started.

An end will be deemed to have started if the jack has been delivered before the warning bell starts ringing. The jack will be deemed to have been delivered the instant it leaves the hand (it does not need to be at rest when the bell starts ringing).

A jack coming to rest illegally after the 7 minute bell has ceased ringing will be 'placed' by the opposing skip, who may also direct where the mat is to be positioned.

An end, once begun, will be played to the finish.

No trial ends will be allowed.

No player will visit the head during the course of a match.

Skips must leave the head together and not return to the head under any circumstances. Other members of the team will not go to the head until all players (except the skips) have delivered all their bowls. The penalty will be one shot deducted from the offending team's score for each offence.

B8 FIXED NUMBER OF ENDS LEAGUE MATCHES

These matches shall be a maximum of 3 hours duration (including trial ends, if played).

2 points will be awarded for a Win

1 point for a Draw.

The match will not start until the start of session bell rings

Trial ends will be allowed.

Reasonable visiting the head will be allowed.

When a jack is delivered illegally the Laws of the Sport of Indoor Bowls will be applied.

If, during the course of an end, the jack is caused to leave the

BYE-LAWS FOR CLUB LEAGUES

side of the rink, the end will be replayed.

B9 LATE ARRIVAL, DEPLETED TEAMS AND RETIREMENTS

A late arrival in a fours match may start play at the 2nd or 3rd end and a normal game played (provided that both leads and seconds have bowled the regulation number of woods each in the 1st, and where applicable, 2nd ends).

In a depleted fours match (i.e. three players only), leads and seconds should use 3 woods each and the skip 2 woods. The team (or teams) of three will forfeit 25% of their total score. If a team plays with three players on more than three occasions the forfeit will be increased to 40% of their total score for all the depleted fours matches that they play thereafter. These adjustments shall be calculated exactly by the League Secretary. For example, if a team of three has scored 13 shots at the end of a match and they have previously played two matches with only three players, 25% will be deducted from the score of 13 resulting in a final match score of 9.75 shots. However, if a team of three has scored 16 shots at the end of a match and they have previously played three or more matches with only three players, 40% will be deducted from the 16 resulting in a final match score of 9.6 shots.

In a depleted triples match (i.e. two players only), leads and skips should use 4 woods each. The team of three playing in a depleted triples match shall play as a normal triple (i.e. each player shall use 3 woods each). As for all other league matches, the team that wins an end shall take the mat and deliver the jack on the next end. However, the team of three players shall always play the first wood following delivery of the jack, regardless of the team that has delivered the jack. They will, therefore also be the last to play in any end, playing their ninth wood after the eight and final wood of the opposing team of two has been played. This will ensure alternate bowls are played throughout the game. The team of two players will have to manage their changeover positions accordingly. The team (or teams) of two will forfeit 25% of

BYE-LAWS FOR CLUB LEAGUES

their total score. If a team plays with two players on more than three occasions the forfeit will be increased to 40% of their total score for all the depleted triples matches that they play thereafter. These adjustments shall be calculated exactly by the League Secretary. Examples of these calculations are as for a depleted fours game, shown above.

Depleted teams (fours or triples) must still abide by the league playing constitution (e.g. if a mixed league, one of the team actually bowling must be of the opposite sex to other team members also bowling), otherwise bye-law B6 applies.

The non-attendance of one player in a pair, or two or more players in a triple or a four, will result in the game being forfeited and a 10-0 score recorded against the offending team (see Bye Law A6).

If, during a match, one member of a 'triples' or 'fours' team 'retires', on medical grounds, the match may be completed by the remaining members of the team without penalty provided that the remaining members of team continue to bowl with the same number of bowls each. Alternatively, the remaining members of the team may opt to play as a depleted triple or four, in which case they will forfeit 25% of their total score.

B9 PROMOTIONS and RELEGATIONS

At the end of the season, for two division leagues, the bottom two teams in the upper division will normally be relegated, and the top two teams in the lower division will normally be promoted. Changes to the league structure for the following season may make this impractical, and this procedure may be varied at the League Secretary's discretion.

B10 WITHDRAWALS

In the event of any team withdrawing from a league during the season, the League Secretary shall have discretion over filling the vacancy.

Should a team not be replaced, all results recorded against that team will be discounted in compiling the league table.

BYE-LAWS FOR CLUB COMPETITIONS

C1 CLUB COMPETITION ENTRIES.

Means of entry to Club Competitions shall be by submission of the appropriate entry form, together with entry fees, before the closing date stated on the form.

Entry forms will be available at the start of each season, and will show the fixed dates and times for the Semi-finals for each competition shown thereon, as well as the dates for Finals Weekend. In signing and submitting the entry form, competitors are agreeing that they and their team will abide by these bye-laws and observe the following conditions of entry:

1. Members may not enter/participate in CIBC competitions if they have entered or subsequently take part in club competitions at another Indoor Bowling Club in the same season, where participation in those competitions would conflict with the CIBC Semi-final Dates and/or Finals Weekend.
2. Competitors who become eligible to enter any External Competition by virtue of success in a competition at CIBC will represent the Club in that competition, should they choose to enter it.
3. Competitors agree that they and their team, will be available to play on the fixed dates/times of the competition semi-finals should they reach these stages, and at the times selected by the Competition Secretaries for Finals Weekend.

The Bowling Committee may at its discretion disqualify competitors from current and future competitions for non-observance of these conditions.

Following the closing date for entries the draws for the competitions will take place. Progress sheets detailing the draws, the closing dates for each round (see C5 below) and updated results will be posted on the Competitions notice board at intervals during the season.

C2 ROUNDS UP TO THE SEMI-FINALS.

Competitions shall be played as follows.

Singles: First to 21 shots - always played to the finish.

Pairs: 21 ends, or four hours, whichever is the shorter.

Triples: 18 ends, or four hours, whichever is the shorter.

Fours: 21 ends, or four hours, whichever is the shorter.

2 Wood Pairs: See below for special rules for this event.

Novice Pairs: See below for special rules for this event

C3 PLAYING CONVENTIONS

Matches subject to the four hour session rule: two trial ends and visiting the head are allowed. If after the required number of ends have been played the scores are level an extra end shall be played if this can be done within the four hour time limit. If it cannot, and for any match subject to this rule, where after four hours the scores are level, the winners will be decided on number of ends won. If both sides have won an equal number of ends the side winning the last completed end will be deemed the winners.

Singles matches: the first to reach 21 shots is the winner. If the match is not completed within a 2 hour session, it may only be continued if the rink is free for the following session, otherwise it must be continued on a different (free) rink or at some other time to be agreed by the players concerned. No visiting the head is permitted until both players have played at least 2 bowls each. The penalty will be one shot deducted from the offending player's score for each infringement of this rule. All 'no-ends' to be re-played.

2 wood pairs: rounds up to the semi-finals shall be the best of 3 sets of 7 ends each, subject to an overall two hours maximum time limit. Matches should be played in a designated club two hour session.

Teams shall toss a coin for right to deliver jack at start of first set, then alternate for subsequent sets. In the event a match goes to a deciding set teams shall toss a coin for the right to deliver the jack at the start of this set. No trial ends

BYE-LAWS FOR CLUB COMPETITIONS

are permitted in rounds up to the semi-finals. Dead ends are to be re-played. In rounds prior to the semi-finals visiting the head is not permitted and skips must leave the head together in these rounds.

Each set shall be played to determine a winner so that where a set is tied after seven ends an extra end (or ends in the event of a dead end or tied end) shall be played. Where time does not permit a set to be completed the score standing at the completion of the last end, i.e. the end during which the seven minute bell sounded, shall count as the score for that set. In the event the match is tied the winner of the most number of ends overall in the match shall be the winner. If this still leaves the match tied the winner will be the winner of the last end played.

The semi-finals and final shall be the best of 5 sets of 7 ends, and subject to the four hour rule.

Novice Pairs: rounds up to the semi-finals shall be played under the rules for a two hour **league** match as per bye-law A7. Semi-finals and finals shall be played subject to the rules for a normal pairs competition match as per bye-law C2 above.

C4 RULES FOR CONSTITUTION OF TEAMS.

A mixed fours team shall consist of two ladies and two gentlemen.

In pairs, triples and fours, players taking part in the first game constitute the team. One substitute may be used in succeeding rounds provided that he/she has not already entered the competition. In this context 'entered' is taken to mean: has played in an earlier round or has been named in the draw. If a substitute is required for more than one round, the same substitute shall be used. In mixed competitions, two substitutes, one of each sex, are permitted but only one of the substitutes may be used in a game.

Rules where a match cannot be played

If a team cannot, allowing for the use of a substitute, fulfil a match either in the current or a future round of a competition,

it must withdraw from the competition immediately, and the Captain shall notify this to his or her opponents and the appropriate Competition Secretary (see bye-law A6).

Non-attendance of one player in a pair, triple, or four will result in the game being forfeited by the offending team.

- C5 THE CLOSING DATES** for the rounds of each competition up to the semi-finals will be posted by the Competition Secretaries once the competition draw has been completed. No extension will be granted beyond the closing dates of the rounds without the agreement of the appropriate Competition Secretary. Matches may only be played later than the posted date if the rink booked for the match is taken by a national or other senior competition, or at discretion of appropriate Competition Secretary. If a competitor is awarded a walkover by his or her opposition, the appropriate Competition Secretary must be notified accordingly on or before the closing date of the round. Failure to play a match on or before the closing date of the round may result in the elimination of both competitors from that competition.

C7 PROCEDURES FOR ROUNDS UP TO THE SEMI-FINALS.

The Challenger i.e. the first named player on the draw sheet must offer his or her opponent the choice of two dates (one of which must be at a weekend). For the first round these dates are to be not less than 14 days before the closing date of that round, and where it is a second or subsequent round, the offer of dates must be made within 8 days of the closing date of the previous round. In the event the challenger defaults on this procedure the second named player then becomes the challenger and shall offer any two dates before the closing date of the round.

Note: For rounds up to the semi-final the challenger will be responsible for providing the marker.

For rink booking procedures see bye-law A7 above

A3),

Two trial ends are allowed as is visiting the head at any time.

All matches are subject to the four hour rule.

Two Wood Pairs matches to be best of 5 sets of 7 ends.

The Novice Pairs will be played as a normal pairs competition, i.e. to 21 ends

The Club will arrange markers for singles matches.

All finals will have an official Umpire appointed by the Club

NOTES FOR LEAGUE TEAM CAPTAINS

Things to do . . .

Registration of Teams.

Register your team - whether existing or new - in the Captains' Signing-On Book held in Reception. The deadlines for signing up your teams are shown on the front covers of the summer and winter books and reminders are posted on the club notice boards.

Recruitment of Players.

There is a folder at Reception which lists the names of players looking for teams and in which team captains looking for players can enter their requirements. Talk to other players and other captains who very often know if either is looking for more players.

Fixtures for the Season.

The season's fixtures are normally sent to winter captains during August and to summer captains in early March. Included with these league fixtures is a registration form, asking for the membership number and names of the players within your team. The registration form has to be returned to the League Secretary together with the registration fee for each team. The current fee and return date are shown on the form.

Please note that additional players can be registered at any time during the season.

Selection for Matches

There are pro forma league sheets which show the day and dates on which matches are played and room in which to enter your teams details as requested. Captains use these sheets to inform players of their selection. As previously mentioned should you need any help please do not hesitate to ask.

Who Pays For What?

Registration Fee –

The captain collects the required amount from each of his players having already paid for the team's registration earlier.

NOTES FOR LEAGUE TEAM CAPTAINS

Rink fees -

Each player pays their own green fee, usually to the skip or player who has 'bought the card' for their team prior to the start of their match.

Fines -

Whilst the captain is responsible to the club for paying any due fines, it is the team's responsibility to ensure the captain is not out of pocket and to come to an agreement as to how to deal with this matter. Bye-law A5 applies to the team as a whole, not only to the captain.

COACHING

COACHING SCHOOL

The school has a coaching staff of some 25 coaches who are trained to give instruction at different levels. The coaches will provide basic instruction for beginners, run improvers classes and give individual clinics for experienced bowlers as requested.

Training courses for beginners

Courses of 4 two hour sessions are run on Saturday mornings and Friday evenings to suit a pupil's requirements. The course follows the guidelines laid down in the EBCS syllabus. By the end of the 4-week course the pupil should be proficient enough to take part in the club bowling activities and play in the club's 'friendly' matches.

Improver Training

Courses of 2 two-hour sessions are run at convenient times during the season to suit the pupils. The course includes a video session followed by an improvement clinic. The second session includes practice techniques to improve obtaining line and length and exercises in reading a head.

Dress Code

The club's dress code is relaxed for coaching school pupils under instruction, whereby smart casual clothing may be worn during the training sessions. This also applies to novice bowlers having 'roll-up' sessions, and is intended to encourage new bowlers to participate more fully in the game in their initial few weeks in the club, perhaps whilst deciding whether the game is for them or not!

COACHING

Coaching training

The coaching school train coaches for the local outdoor clubs. Full instruction is given to qualify a coach to the EBCS syllabus and advice and support then offered to the coach in their outdoor club, particularly in the training of new bowlers.

Skills Seminars

Throughout the summer Surrey County coaching teams will visit an outdoor club and run a skills seminar consisting of a day of coaching and practice for the club members. Camberley coaches support these activities and the coaching school will arrange a seminar for a local club on request.

CAMBERLEY CRUSADERS JUNIOR SECTION

The **Camberley Crusaders** is the U/18 Youth Section of Camberley & District Indoor Bowling Club. The section was first formed in the Season 2000-01 when a small group of members' children/grandchildren were allocated a free training period on Saturday mornings from 08:30 – 10:00 a.m.

Since those early days the youth section has grown and now the youth play in the Surrey Youth Inter-Club League, EBYDS (English Bowls Youth Development Scheme) U/15 and U/18 Competitions, CIBC Easter Tournament and Inter-Club Friendly matches.

Saturday morning is still the main 'training day', when rinks are available for roll-ups from 8.00am: training practice and coaching starts promptly at 8:30, and finishes no later than 10.00am: breakfast is available from that time at a very reasonable rate!

Coaching is a very important part of the Crusaders itinerary – skills tests are an essential element of taking part in the English Bowls Youth Development Scheme tournaments run from County to National level. Over the years many of the Crusaders have represented the Club at County and Area Schools of Excellence. Presently, our Crusaders hold the Surrey U15 Singles Trophy.

The Crusaders run their own internal competitions that include U12, U15 and U18 singles championships.

Once Crusaders are judged to be capable of playing with the adults they are encouraged to join the main club as a Junior Member at a annual fee of £10. This membership allows the youth to some of the facilities of the club at half price - the exceptions being the club friendly matches that include a meal, and adult club competitions, when they pay full fee.,

(Combined points total of the Skills Tests and Singles Competition). The day started at 8:45am and ended at 15.45pm -- a long day for a player so young.

Addison's performance surpassed all expectations as he won all three of his group games to reach the semi-final stages, which he duly won and was quite outstanding when winning the final by 8 shots to 3.

Addison also won the Overall Winner's shield as he achieved more points than any other competitor when adding the total number of points in the singles competition to those in the skills tests.

Addison was rewarded with a place in the Southern Region finals on the 1st April 2012 where he won 2 and lost 1 of his league games. However, he did not progress to the next stage of the National School of Excellence. Still a remarkable effort for someone so young in an under 15 competition.

INFORMATION FOR NEW BOWLERS

What's going on?

Most new or inexperienced bowlers joining Camberley and District Indoor Bowling Club without a guide or mentor must have wondered, from time to time, what it's all about. Surely bowls is all about getting on the green and bowling up one's woods. Well yes - but no!

Very soon it becomes obvious that 'getting on the green' involves a little bit more. These notes seek to offer some help to any club member wanting to become involved.

Firstly then, an explanation of which bowls events can be found to be taking place, and when. Lets break it down into component parts:

Leagues

Most operate as a single division only, others have two divisions with promotion and relegation. Each league (or division of a league) is composed of 6 or more teams, each run by a self appointed team captain. Each team must have a minimum number of players (as defined in the club bye-laws). Leagues are played from Monday opening at 10.00am through to Friday closing at 10.30p.m., with the exception of Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons (see friendly matches below).

A Sunday Night league designed especially for new members will run from end of October.

The League Programme is provided earlier in this booklet.

Friendly Matches

These are generally played against other Clubs (Indoor and Outdoor) or Bowling Associations. Lists are displayed in the foyer of the club and (within the format of the match) are there for any member of the club to append his or her name to indicate their availability for match selection.

Generally, but not exclusively, Tuesday matches are for ladies, Wednesdays for men - however both days offer a number of mixed matches. Weekend games on Saturday and Sunday afternoons vary in format, but are mostly mixed. Afternoon matches are of 18 or 21 ends duration (depending on whether teams are made up of triples or rinks (i.e. 3 or 4 bowlers) and

usually played in ‘whites’. There are also matches arranged for Saturday evenings, usually against local outdoor clubs - these matches are 18 ends, and played in ‘greys’. Occasionally matches are arranged as ‘in-house’ games, e.g. Ladies v Gentlemen.

A summary of all friendly fixtures appears earlier in this booklet.

Competitions

Here matters become more complex, as there is considerable variety in the type and number of competitions that may be entered. Let’s try to unravel the complexity:

Club Competitions

These are open to all members, who can enter any (or all), as appropriate, of singles, pairs, triples or rinks (i.e. fours) for ladies or men. There are mixed pairs and rinks for both ladies and men to enter together, as well as an ‘over 60’s’ singles, and a ‘2-wood’ pairs, which are ‘open’ competitions. All club competitions are played on a ‘knock-out’ basis. A new competition is to be run this year for ‘Novice’ bowlers, with less than 3 years’ experience, as an open pairs event.

County Competitions - Men

In accordance with Surrey County Indoor Bowling Association (SCIBA) rules, the club enter the previous year’s winners, runners-up and semi-finalists of the club men’s singles, men’s pairs and men’s triples championships to the equivalent county championships for the next season. The club singles champion is also entered for the national champion of champions competitions.

The club also enters the winners of the club men’s fours championship for the following season’s London & Southern Counties Bowling Association’s Indoor Fours Championship.

Other Surrey County competitions include over 60’s men’s singles, men’s fours, mixed pairs and mixed fours, which are open to all club members who wish to enter as an appropriately structured team.

County Competitions - Ladies

INFORMATION FOR NEW BOWLERS

Ladies county competitions were restricted to triples and rinks only, and open to any lady club members who wish to enter as a team. From 2010, there have also been Over 50s Singles and Under 31 Singles to enter. See the Surrey County Women's Indoor Bowling Association (SCWIBA) handbook for details (a club copy is available for inspection, by the correspondence pigeon holes, located in the entrance hall).

National Competitions

Usually entered by individual members who 'fancy their chances' as bowlers, and want to bowl at a higher level. Here is good quality bowling offering opportunities to play away at other clubs, where the draw permits, with the eventual aim at appearing at national finals. Very challenging, especially in arranging times and venues.

County, Regional and National INTER-CLUB Competitions

Teams for these competitions are selected by the Team Manager to represent the club. Again the matches, and their play by/on dates (where available at publication time) are shown in this booklet.

Roll-Ups

These are a long-standing part of the bowls world. Although limited rink space has been scheduled for roll-ups, there are also rinks available which can be used for this purpose. Keep an eye on the rink book at Reception. The club also runs 'club drives' on days where there are no matches. Players play in teams, which 'swap' about every four ends. The object is to be the bowler with greatest number of shots scored during the overall game. Again, watch the notice board for details!

Tournaments

Various tournaments, generally restricted to club members only, have been run very successfully in the past, both at the New year and Easter (Good Friday). These are usually whole day affairs, played by up to 24 teams on a mini-league basis, followed by semi-finals and finals between the winners of the mini-leagues.

Watch the notice board for details, these days are very enjoyable.

Summary

INFORMATION FOR NEW BOWLERS

That's the bowling activity within the club - and, of course, you are saying "How do I fit in?". In short the answer is to help yourself, but a few comments may help - let's look at each section separately:

Leagues:

There are books at the Reception Desk in which you can show that you are available to join a league - enter appropriate details of name, telephone number, membership number, and when you are available to play. There is also a book for league team captains to advertise for additional players to join their teams: it is up to you to look in these books and proceed from there.

You may join any number of teams but, of course, can play for only one team in any league.

If you want to form your own team, you may do so at the end of the season, when the league programme is being scheduled for the following year. The League Secretary will place a book at Reception for all existing captains to confirm their entries, and for new teams to register where there are vacancies in the league structure.

Friendly Matches:

Don't be worried about joining in here. This is the place to learn what bowling is all about. Put your name down on the availability sheets. Make sure you get to know the Captain of the day, and enjoy your game.

Club Competitions:

These are open to all members. Please note that these matches are played on a "knock-out" basis.

Competition Entry Forms are produced each year (usually in September/October) detailing all Individual Club Competitions that may be entered, which should be completed and returned (together with appropriate Entry Fees) to the relevant Competition Secretary, by the date stated on the form for play in the same Season

County and National competitions:

County singles, pairs and triples (men only) can only be entered

INFORMATION FOR NEW BOWLERS

by reaching the semi-finals of the club singles, pairs and/or triples competitions. Other county competitions are open to all.

For ladies, there are Under 31 Singles, Over 50s Singles, Triples and Fours county competitions open to all lady members who wish to enter either singly or as a team.

All national competitions are open to all members.

Competition Entry Forms are produced each year (usually in February) detailing all Individual County and National Competitions that may be entered which should be completed and returned (together with appropriate Entry Fees) to the relevant Competition Secretary, by the date stated on the form for play in the following Season

Inter-Club Competitions:

It is unlikely that new or inexperienced bowlers would be selected for these highly competitive Inter-Club Competitions (e.g. Denny Cup, Yetton Trophy etc). Nevertheless the dates and venues for these matches are published in this book, and any support that you can give would be very welcome, and much appreciated by the members selected to play.

Roll-Ups and Club Drives:

An excellent way of measuring your abilities against other members, as well as improving your bowling. More importantly, perhaps, a chance to get to know other members. Roll-ups and club drives are also very good fun - do join in!

Tournaments:

Notices are posted on the club notice boards in good time before these events. Keep in touch - because of the limitations of rink space, entries are generally restricted - so get in early if you want to play.

There are excellent coaching facilities available at the club. Please read the section under COACHING for more information.
